

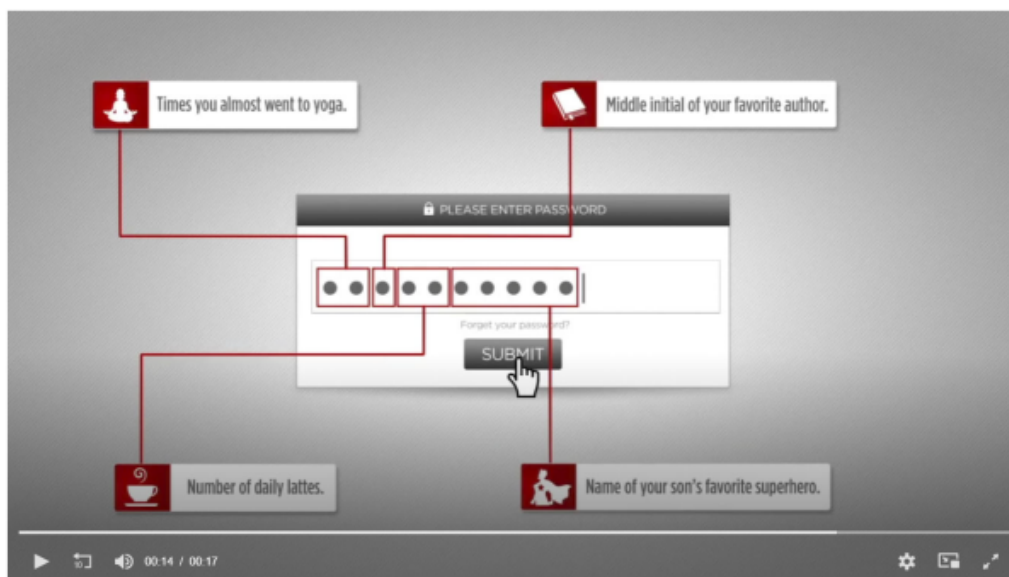
Once you receive the welcome email from LastPass, click on the Activate LastPass button in the email.



Fill in the activation code from the email and make sure that your email address is correct. Make sure you create a strong master password - the Strength Meter will show you how you are doing.

Here are some suggestions on creating a strong password that you can remember.

Summary

The first step in setting up your LastPass account is creating a strong, unique master password. Use a password that's memorable because LastPass won't save it for you. It's the only password you have to remember.

As you'll see in the video, we recommend using a "passphrase" for your master password, like `tony$growler$vent$15` - it's meaningless to others and difficult for hackers to guess, but something you can commit to memory.

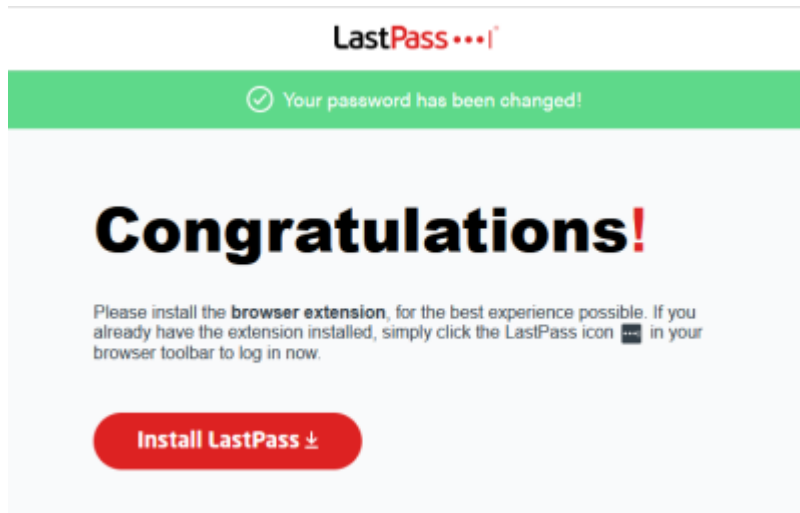
Here are a few more reasons why phrases make the best passwords:

- They're longer, usually 12-20 characters
- They're completely random
- They're easy to say and read

Plus, they are fun to think up - so get creative!

Go ahead and install LastPass Password Manager extension(s) in the browser(s) you use by clicking on the Install LastPass button. It will take you to the appropriate extension install for the browser you are using to enable your account.
